Here are the following environmental programs: LEAF program (Leaders in Environmental Action Force) is an innovative and transformative educational program through which we have trained more than 2200 students. Green Teachers Program (GTP) equips the teachers with innovative modules for environmental education programs. So far 43 schools in Gujarat and 25 schools in other states have participated. We have trained more than 300 teachers. Through Environment Awareness Program, we have engaged 13000 youth, women and children in the villages, towns and cities in Gujarat.

Green the Blue Charitable Trust achieved a significant milestone in its journey during 2023-2024. With the generous support of the JCB Literature Foundation, the Trust successfully established three children's libraries in government schools across Gujarat. Throughout the year, the Trust managed these libraries and conducted a variety of library-related activities, developing considerable expertise in storytelling programs and library management.

Green the Blue staff participated in two key training programs—one in Bhopal and the other in Vadodara—while also engaging in regular online training sessions hosted by the Free Library Network. These programs have benefited numerous children, providing valuable opportunities for reading and learning. Leveraging their storytelling expertise, the staff extended these sessions beyond the library walls, reaching a wider audience.

This report highlights the impact of the Qissa Pitara Library Project, and we are confident that our efforts will continue to reach children who lack access to quality children's literature, through some of the best publications available in the field. 2.1.1 QISSA PITARA CHILDREN'S LIBRARY

- The Qissa Pitara project, supported by the JCB Literature Foundation, has achieved notable success over the past ten months in fostering a love for reading and holistic development among children in underserved areas. Engaging students from St. Joseph's Primary School, Ashadeep Ashram Shala, and Chitalda Primary School, the initiative has facilitated diverse activities including storytelling, art therapy, and creative workshops. With a total of 800 book club members and 13 active book clubs, the project has seen impressive participation and book borrowing statistics.
- The project has successfully addressed challenges such as limited library time and high student engagement through innovative solutions and strong stakeholder collaboration. Future plans include the development of library software, conducting summer camps focused on story writing and illustration, and enhancing library displays. Overall, the Qissa Pitara project has significantly enriched students' learning experiences, and Green the Blue Trust extends sincere gratitude to the JCB Literature Foundation for their invaluable support, looking forward to another year of impactful progress and innovation.

2.1.2.Achievements and Impact:

Engagement and Participation: The project has consistently engaged a significant number of students across multiple activities, including storytelling sessions, art therapy, word games, and workshops. The participation numbers indicate a strong interest and enthusiasm among the students.






Community Engagement: The project has also involved parents, teachers, and school management, creating a collaborative environment focused on the holistic development of the children. The positive feedback from stakeholders underscores the project's impact and relevance.

2.1.3. Findings of the Survey conducted in April 2024 to gauge the impact: GBT Team conducted a small survey in the first week of April to gauge the impact of Qissa Pitara Library set up in three schools. 241 students from all the three schools participated in the survey. The findings of the survey are given in the annexure. The Survey was conducted by Ms Monika Gamit, Priyanka & Mr Jothi Xavier. We present here in the chart:









The findings indicate that the Qissa Pitara program has significantly influenced students' involvement in book club activities and their skill development in reading, writing, drawing, and crafts, leading to overall growth across the three schools. However, the survey could have captured more student responses if conducted in March rather than during exams, as some students were unable to participate due to their exam schedules.

2.2.1.CAREER DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

CAREER GUIDANCE PROGRAM





The Career Guidance Workshops with the support of GACL & Jeevantirth were conducted by Green the Blue Charitable Trust in 25 semi-urban and rural schools in Baroda, reaching 3,528 students. The program aimed to raise awareness about diverse career options beyond ITI courses and to inspire students to set SMART (specific, Measurable, Achievable, Realistic and Timebound) goals. Through interactive presentations, students learned about career opportunities after the 10th and 12th grades, the importance of career counselling, and goal setting. The workshops utilized short films, posters, and booklets in Gujarati to effectively engage students and motivate them to pursue their ambitions confidently.











2.3. ART PROGRAMS

2.3.1.SUMMER CAMP AT ST. JOSEPH'S HIGH SCHOOL, BARODA

Qissa Pitara Summer camp for book club members of St. Joseph's High school, Vadodara was conducted on 24th & 25th of April 2024. The workshop was conducted after the students had completed their final exams, providing them with an opportunity to engage in creative activities during their free time. The summer workshop was focused on storytelling and story illustration, aimed at fostering creativity and artistic expression among students. We explored monoprint using collagraph the outcome of it is presented here. Students used waste cardboard papers for the activity. Each print is accompanied with a story which will be compiled into a booklet soon. Thanks to JCB Literature Foundation for their encouragement and support.





2.3.2. SUMMER CAMP AT CHITALDA:

તથા ખેતીમાં સારો પાક થાય તેવા આસીવાંદ આપે છે. આ ઉપરાંત દિવાળી ઉપર અને ખેતીમાં સારો પાક-ઉપજ થાય ત્યારે ખાસ પ્રકારનું નૃત્ય કરવામાં આવે છે જેને

ક્તતા હતા અન વર કન્યાનું વિગ્ર હોય છે. આ દેવીઓ દેપતિને સંતાન પ્રાપ્તિ હોવાથી આજ સુધી બચી રહી છે. માટે અને વેશવેલો આગળ વધારવા હોવાથી આજ સુધી બચી રહી છે. વર્લી સમુદાયમાં ચિત્રકળા એક ધાર્મિક પરંપરા હોવાથી અસ્તિત્વ ટકી રહ્યું : નરેશ ભોયે


